CATHERINE WHEELWRIGHT

Catherine emigrated from Bruree, Ireland in 1879, settled in New York City and in 1890, moved to Rochester, New York. In 1916, after Easter Rising, Catherine helped save her son's life when he was captured by the British. As one of the leaders of the Rising, Éamon de Valera was sentenced to death for his involvement in the rebellion. However, Éamon's mother urged the United States Government to intervene as Éamon was born in America and thus an American citizen. The British conceded, sentenced Éamon to life in prison instead and ultimately, he was released a year later under an amnesty agreement. Éamon de Valera would go on to lead Anti-Treaty Irish through the Irish Civil War and after its defeat he founded the Fianna Fáil party. He was elected Taoiseach (prime minister) three times and resigned in 1959 after being elected as the President in Ireland—a position he held until 1973. Catherine Coll de Valera Wheelwright's actions prevented her son's execution and allowed him to turn into the leader that history remembers. Catherine resided in Rochester with her second husband,

Charles E. Wheelwright and had two children named Thomas and Ann. Thomas became a Catholic priest and performed the funeral rites at his mother's service.

Catherine Wheelwright is one of many prestigious and notable women buried at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

MARCH 17: St. Patrick - Patron Saint of Ireland

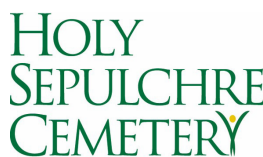
