Red Bird Ministries serves ordinary families who have been given an extraordinary cross to carry.

The loss of a child can be one of the most difficult things for a parent to experience. For anyone who has had such a painful loss, Holy Sepulchre Cemetery would like to extend our sincere sympathy to you and your family and let you know that you are in our continued prayers.

Red Bird Ministries exists as an organization that serves ordinary families who have been given an extraordinary cross to carry called "child loss". They are committed to the community of grieving families who pursue healing through their Catholic faith. Red Bird systematically guides individuals and couples through the complexity and trauma that occurs with the loss of a child from pregnancy

through adulthood. Their holistic approach focuses on 4 aspects of grief/healing: emotional, psychological, relational, and spiritual.

Red Bird Ministries now offers grief support through their app where you can watch videos and connect during weekly check-ins (free to download, but there is a fee for a monthly subscription).

Holy Sepulchre Cemetery has partnered with Red Bird Ministries and will be hosting a workshop for couples who have had a loss of a child. The Loving Through Loss Couples Workshop is designed to help couples understand how the trauma of child loss affects the family dynamic and how to love each other through the complexity of loss. # WHO CAN BE BURIED AT OUR CEMETERIES

Our Mission reads: Holy Sepulchre Cemetery will assist the Church in fulfilling its ministry to bury the deceased of the faith community in consecrated ground. Its Cemeteries will serve as a sacred and peaceful site of beauty where family and friends can gather in prayer and remembrance. As places of Christian burial, Holy Sepulchre Cemeteries reflects respect for the human person, belief in the resurrection of the body, and the hope of Eternal Life. We are dedicated to the Christian burial of all members of the Catholic Faith Community, and to comfort all those who mourn them.

Holy Sepulchre and Ascension Garden Cemeteries was incorporated to offer compassion of burying the dead, specifically those of the Catholic faith. However, we have no desire to isolate or separate families. As a result, we have families of many different faiths and denominations interred in our cemeteries. Our policies state that families buried

in our cemeteries should either be Catholic or have family members interred, or planning to be interred, within our cemeteries that are Catholic. This allows for families to be buried together regardless of their faith. Many Catholic cemeteries now allow for the burial of non-Catholics. There is nothing in Catholic canon law that prevents a non-Catholic from being buried in a Catholic cemetery. Non-Catholic members of the family such as a spouse, children, parents, and other relatives are commonly acceptable. Other Christian denominations with a connection to the Catholic Community or who hold a primary belief in the resurrection of the dead at the end of time are also welcomed.

We know that the selection of a final resting place reflects the morals and beliefs from one's own life's experience and passage. The Catholic cemetery offers a resting place that is blessed and sanctified with all fellow visitors awaiting resurrection of the dead and the promise of everlasting life.

Our desire is to assist individuals and families during one of the most challenging times in their lives, and to help them know that they are not alone. We often receive feedback from families who have indicated that our Family Service Counselors genuinely care about them. At Holy Sepulchre and Ascension Garden Cemeteries, we have faith that each human body has housed the breath of God. The human body should be valued and respected and have a place of rest where the recollection of the deceased will not be forgotten. We welcome those who share these beliefs.


By watching our team in action, we try to live in all traits of what we do; we believe this is not so much as a job for our team members – but a true calling.

# Embracing a New Year while Grieving

As we go into a new year many start resolutions, fresh starts & hopeful beginning. However, for those grieving the death of a loved one, the new year can be daunting.

Here are a few reminders for those who are embarking on a new year after the loss of a loved one:

ACKNOWLEDGE HOW YOU ARE FEELING - Allow yourself space when dealing with your feelings. There is no timeline for grief, and everyone experiences this differently. Never feel guilty for how you feel, do not rush to get rid of the grief, grief is hanging onto love and that is the reason you will always feel it.

LEAN ON SUPPORT SYSTEMS – Surround yourself with family and friends that can provide you support. Some may not be able to and that is ok. Seek professional help through your community and church. Seek others who are grievers. We prefer to find people already in our life who are also grieving.

STARTING A NEW YEAR IS A NEW BEGINNING, CONSIDER HELPING OTHERS IN NEED – Volunteer your time to work with children who have experienced trauma. Volunteer at an animal or food shelter, donate food or clothing to families in need. Helping others is a great way to feel good and release some of the negative feelings we are experiencing.

SET REALISTIC EXPECTATIONS - This is a gradual process. There is no right or wrong to grief. A new year does not mean to leave your grief behind. It's a continuing journey. Your grief is sacred. Treat your grief with the sadness it deserves and needs. Acknowledge we cannot be the same person we were before. Remember to take care of yourself, self-care is a very important part of your journey.



## ONGOING SUPPORT: FLORAL SERVICE

We proudly offer many ways to honor those who have gone before us. Throughout history, flowers have been placed on graves or planted graveside to honor the memory of the departed. Spring (March 1 to May 31)
Summer (June 1 to August 31)
Fall (September 1 to November 30)
Winter (December 1 to February 28)

The program can be purchased for 1 year (4 seasons), 3 years (12 seasons) or 5 years (20 seasons).



We also offer aluminum vases for purchase for any inground plots for fresh flowers to be placed by family.


