SPRING CLEAN-UP

The period between March 15th and May 1st is traditionally used by the Cemetery to clean and prepare the grounds for spring. Please refrain from planting or placing new decorations during this period with the exception of Easter-related decorations.

FOR YOUR SAFETY

The Cemetery reserves the right to remove and dispose of any plantings or decorations at any time that violate the rules and regulations described in this document. The Cemetery shall not be responsible, nor liable, for ensuring that flowers, plantings and decorations placed on graves will remain in place. When possible, non-regulation items that are removed by Cemetery personnel shall be placed in the fenced storage area located near the Cemetery's main office at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, or in the garage of the main office at Ascension Garden Cemetery.

REGULATIONS FOR PLANTINGS & DECORATIONS

To The Families We Serve.

To preserve the beauty and dignity of Holy Sepulchre & Ascension Garden Catholic Cemeteries, we have instituted the following rules and regulations for grave plantings and decorations. For the safely of all we serve, your cooperation is appreciated.

SPECIAL SECTION LIMITATIONS

Applies to Queen of Heaven, Lawn Crypts, all Cremation and Natural Green Burial sections at both cemeteries

Plantings are not permitted in these sections. Flowers may be placed in a removable green cone or other in-ground type vase that can be moved for mowing and lawn care.

Aluminum vases are available for sale by cemetery.

FLOWERS PLANTED ON GRAVES

Fresh flowers and plantings are welcome except in the sections noted under Special Section Limitations above. Plantings may not exceed 12 inches from the front of the marker and 18 inches in height. Artificial flowers or ornaments are not permitted.

For lots with graves in front of the monument, plantings are allowed in the front of the monument. For lots with graves in front and back of the monument, plantings are allowed in the front and back of the monument. All plantings may not exceed the length of the monument.

We recommend deer-resistant varieties of plants.




FRESH FLOWERS

Flowers may be placed in an in-ground vase that can be moved for mowing and lawn care. Permanent flower vases can be purchased at the cemetery office. Potted plants, up to 8 inches in diameter, are permitted. For safety reasons, glass, ceramic or other breakable items are not permitted. Funeral flowers will be removed by the cemetery on the day of the interment. Should members of the family wish to preserve some of the funeral flowers, we ask that they be taken from the grave immediately following the interment service.

PERMANENT PLANTINGS

The planting of shrubs, bushes and trees is not permitted. Please do not trim or remove any existing shrubs, bushes or trees that have been planted by the Cemetery. The Cemetery has an annual program of tree trimming, removal and replacement based on its long-term maintenance program.





WINTER DECORATIONS

Wreaths, natural or artificial, may be placed on graves from November 15th to March 15th. Removal of winter decorations begins on March 15th, depending on weather conditions. Should you wish to save these decorations, please remove them prior to March 15th.

Wreaths may be set on stands or attached to monuments. Please use nonmetallic cord as metallic cord may rust/permanently stain monuments. For safety reasons, do not use metal stakes in the ground.

OTHER DECORATIONS

American flags, not exceeding 12" x 18" in size, may be placed in the ground directly in front of the headstone year-round. Attaching flags to headstones is strictly prohibited. The Cemetery will remove any flags that are in poor shape and properly dispose of them with respect for our American flag.

The following are examples of items that are **not** permitted, including but not limited to: ceramic or glass objects, benches, solar lights, balloons, monument sprays or flower blankets, wind chimes, shepherd's hooks, crosses, temporary grave markers or plaques, statues, toys or novelties and fraternal or military emblems.

Additionally, items are not to be affixed or adhered to stones or monuments under any circumstances.

For safety reasons, mulching with crushed stone, wood chips, shells, or other hard materials is strictly prohibited.

LANDSCAPING AND GENERAL UPKEEP

Edging should be limited to high-grade plastic with a maximum of 2 inches showing above ground. All other edging including, bricks, cement blocks or any other item is not permitted.

The following are not permitted: Use of power mowers or other landscape equipment, by anyone other than cemetery employees; Digging outside of designated planting beds, excavating, altering the grave, laying or removing sod; planting of Zoysia or other non-native grasses (these plants can become invasive and cause serious damage the turf and landscape).
